As a reminder!

Herbert School does have

### video surveillance cameras

in various hallways and common areas of the school as well as the parking lot.

The Chinook School Division may choose to place video surveillance on school buses or other vehicles owned, contracted, or operated by the division.

### Guest Ridership

The only passengers to ride a Chinook School bus are students who attend a Chinook School and ordinarily ride the bus. To assist with unforeseen circumstances, occasionally the Division will allow for **Guest Ridership** if

Chinook Administrative Procedure(AP) 560 is followed and a

### **Guest Rider Consent Form**

is submitted to the school administration.

#### Requests for approval should be submitted with as much notice as possible.

School administration reserves the right to deny requests if adequate notice is not provided, if there are not enough seats available on the bus, or if the pick-up or drop-off point is not a regularly scheduled stop on the route. It is also expected that the guest rider follows the rules of the bus. Please contact your school administration if you have questions regarding Guest Ridership.






#### WHEN WE CONTROL INSTEAD OF COACH

We make it all about us.

When we say: "That's not how you do it. Let me show you."

They think: "I guess Mom can do it better than me."



We don't believe our child might have the capability to do a new task.

When we say: "Go ask your Dad to help you."

They think: "My mom doesn't trust I can do it. She thinks I need help."



We don't consider child's approach to a task.

When we say: "Are you sure that's how you want to do it?"

They think: "I must be doing this the wrong way."

#### WHEN WE EVALUATE

We put judgment instead of fostering a child's internal evaluation.

When we say: "You didn't ask for help and look what happened."

They think: "I guess I don't need to try doing things on my own."





#### CONFIDENCE ISN'T A GIFT WE CAN GIVE OUR CHILDREN.

TRUE CONFIDENCE IS LEARNED THROUGH EXPERIENCES OF TRYING NEW THINGS, EXPERIENCING FAILURE AND SUCCESS, AND...BY HAVING THE EMOTIONAL SUPPORT TO COPE WITH ALL OF IT.



#### WHAT TO SAY INSTEAD

- Coaching = "Here's how I do this; maybe it will work for you."
- Trust = "That's not the way I do it, but give it a try. That approach might work!"
- Not focusing on perfection = "You persisted with that project even though it was difficult."
- Focusing on progress = "You have improved your organizational skills so much."
- Process praise = "I love how you wrote so descriptively in that book report."
- Noticing = "You must feel proud; that project took a lot of work".

"LOOKS LIKE YOU HAD FUN! WHAT PART DID YOU ENJOY THE MOST?"

"THIS WAS NEW! HOW DID YOU FEEL WHEN YOU WERE MAKING THIS?"



"THIS MUST HAVE TAKEN A LOT OF PRACTICE. ARE YOU PROUD?"



"YOU WERE SO FOCUSED ON YOUR WORK: CAN YOU TELL ME ABOUT IT?"



"YOU LOOK VERY EXCITED ABOUT COMPLETING THIS PROJECT! WHAT DID YOU LEARN?"

#### SHIFTING FROM EXTERNAL PRAISE TO INNER AWARENESS

- 1 Hold general praise ("You were great!") and evaluation ("Amazing presentation!") to make room for kids to process their own feelings and opinions.
- Ask open-ended questions and invite children to notice how they feel about their efforts: both the process and the outcome.

#### THIS LEADS TO SELF-RELIANCE AND EMPOWERMENT

As you encourage their reflection, children learn to appreciate their own strengths, which contributes to their confidence and resilience.



In turn, they learn to rely on themselves instead of seeking external praise or evaluation, making them more empowered.
